

Report of the Activities of the College ✓For the Academic Year, 1974-75ADMISSIONS :-

Due to railway strike and late announcement of the results of University, the Colleges affiliated to the Bombay University re-opened later than the scheduled date, i.e. on the 1st of July, 1974 instead of 15th of June, 1974 as usual. However, the enrolment for the First Year Classes was started immediately on the declaration of the S.S.C. Examination results and the admissions were full capacity, long before the opening of the college.

Strength of the College -

The strength of the college is increasing year after year. It has now reached its optimum strength. Table-A below shows the progressive rise in the total strength of the college from its inception, while Table-B shows the present composition and the class-wise break-up of the college for the year, 1974-75.

STARTING OF NEW CLASSES :-

As far as our college is concerned, two significant events of the year need to be mentioned. First, the starting of the B.Com.Part.II Classes with Accounting and Auditing as optional subjects. Both the divisions of the part-II class are full to capacity. Secondly, the college has been recognised this year for registering the students for the degree of M.Com. and also for Ph.D. Thus, the college has become a full-fledged institution providing instructions upto Post-Graduate degrees by research and papers.

College Library :-

For the benefit of the students and of the members of the staff, the college library function from 5.30 a.m. to 9.00 p.m. The lending section of the college is taken full advantage of. The average daily attendance in the library is approximately 25 to 30 members. The present accommodation being inadequate to meet seasonal demand, has been aided by providing additional library space admeasuring 570 sq.ft. The college subscribes to 51 periodicals of which 18 are general and 33 specialised. The total number of books added upto 31st of December, 1974 is 1635. The Library at present possesses 3925 books.

Scholarships & Freeships :-

Apart from the E.B.C. and Government Merit Scholarships and Freeships awarded to the students, the college awards Scholarships and Freeships to deserving and needy students in each term. The Vice-Chancellor, Principal, T.K. Tope inaugurated the activities of the students council for the year 1974-75 on 1st of August, 1974. Prof. Tope delivered his inaugural participated talent contest, helped the Council to discover and mobilise the hidden artistic talents of the Students. By far the most unique function of the year was the Independence Day Celebrations. Apart from the usual entertainment programme, what marked the ceremony was the presentation of the College Flag to the Students' Council. The Chief Guest of the function, Shreeman B.M. Grover, the Chairman, of the Lala Lajpatrai Memorial Trust, presented the blue flag bearing college crest to the Chairman of the Council and administered the oath. The standing audience of Students on the solemn occasion pledged itself to the spirit embodied in the oath. Shreeman Gover, in his speech on the occasion appealed to the Students to be good and reminded them of their responsibilities. On 17th of September, 1974, a blood donation drive was organised in collaboration with the N.S.S. Unit of the College. The response from the Students and the members of the staff was as spontaneous and whole-hearted as during the past years. Regular formal and informal meetings of the Council provide opportunities for purposeful and creative discussions. Out of these meetings sprang one another organisation, an offshoot of the Students' Council, viz. Study Circle. The underlying principle of study circle being that though all students are good and get benefit of the instructions in the class rooms, some are better recipients and are bound to do better. Again in a class, large number makes personal attention of the teacher difficult. With a view to helping weak students in their studies, the Study Circle is conducting its sessions in small batches. The benefit is derived by the willing students of the First Year Classes. The facility is also made available to the Inter Commerce students, but the scheme is restricted only to selected subjects. Mr.

Mr. Pendse, Economic Advisor to Tata's, gave a lucid talk on 'inflation'. Mr. Shantilal Shah of Paragon Textiles and Mr. Sathe, spoke to the students on the scheme of 'Discussion System'. Three lady students of the college participated in the Inter-collegiate Beauty Competition organised by the North Bombay Jaycees. On the 'Foundation Day' of the University, members of the staff acquainted the students with the glorious history of the Bombay University. Mr. Apte and Principal Vyas of the Rotary Club of Bombay North visited the College in connection with the scheme 'Rotract Club'. The students' Council sent its representatives to take part in the talent contest organised by Junior Jaycees.

Our college is well represented in all the University societies. Three of our representatives, are members of the Executive Committee. The College participated in the Bombay University Youth Festival in a big way and came out with a

great success. The College was placed Second as it has bagged 18 points against the N.M.College, which stood First with 19.5 points to its credit. Our college won the First prize in the 'Group Singing Competition', the Second prize in the 'Folk Dance Competition'. We participated in all the plays held in the four languages and our Gujarati play 'Sorry, Wrong Number' bagged the Second Best Production Award, while Miss Nita Shah won the Best Actress Award. Our Hindi play 'Kohetak' won the third Best Production award and Mr. Harish Patel was adjudged to secure the Best Actor Award. The college also participated in the debates and discussions held in all the four languages. Mr. Shailesh Haribhakti of Sr.B.Com. won the Third Prize in English debating while Mr. Uday Vawikar of Int.Com.'C', and Mr. Dināyār Medhora of Sr. B.Com. were placed fourth in the English and Marathi Group Discussion. Miss Anuradha Kshirsagar won the Third Prize in Mono-Acting. On 14th of January, the first talk in the series of talks entitled 'Career Conference' was held. Mr. R. Manikkam, Executive Secretary, ICWA spoke on Cost Accountant and Prof. S.P. Agarwal spoke on Accountant as a career. The series of talks is organised with a view to enlightening students on the prospective opportunities in the different fields and new openings.

The college Annual Day, the culmination of the all the programmes of the year, was held for three successive days, i.e. on 6th, 7th and 8th January, 1975. On the 6th January, the fashion parade and the fancy dress competition were held in the College Auditorium, while on the 7th of January, an enjoyable cricket match was played between the Principal's XI and the Chairman's XI at T.N.M.C. Hostel play-ground.

The main function was held on 8th January, 1975 at Rang-Bhavan. Mr. Ramrao Adik, the Advocate General of Maharashtra and our Chief Guest gave away the prizes to the winners in various college and inter-collegiate competitions. Two Inter-collegiate debates organised by our College in English and Hindi were held on 17th January, 1975 and 21st January, 1975 respectively and the preparation for the Inter-collegiate Gujarati Debating competition is in progress.

Vigorous practice sessions were held in the November vacation to prepare for Inter-Collegiate Matches and competition in Cricket, Volley-ball, Hockey, Kho-Kho, Boxing, Athletics and Cycling. Mr. Rustom A. Havewalla of B.Com. Part-I, won the First Prize in 25 miles cycle Road Race and Second Prize in 15 miles Cycle Road Race conducted by the sprinters Cycling Club, under the auspices of the Maharashtra State Cycling Association. He also secured inter-collegiate Cycling Championship for 1974-75 by securing the First Prize in 3000 meters cycle race and 4000 meters Cycle Race held on 15-1-1975. Mr. Udaykumar Wavikar was invited by the Maharashtra State Table-Tennis Association for undergoing intensive training. Four of our Students successfully completed the Rock Climbing Course conducted by the University.

The College Annual Athletic Meet was conducted in two sessions at the University Sports Pavilion on 2nd and 4th of December, 1974. Mr. Godse Suresh of F.Y.Commerce won the Athletic Championship for men, while Miss Warik Kanchan won the Athletic Championship for ladies. The Gymkhana this year has opened its Gymnasium Wing.

The activities of the Planning Forum for the year were inaugurated on 17th August, 1974 by Prof. C.N. Vakil, the well-known Economist and the Ex-vice Chancellor of South Gujarat University. He gave an illuminating and scholarly talk on "Semibombala and anti-inflationary measures".

The A.D. Shroff Memorial Elocution Competition was held on 12th of September, 1974. As many as fifteen speakers participated. Mr. Dinyar Medhora won the First Prize, Mr. Lawrence Rodrigues the Second Prize and Miss Magdalena Vaz Third prize. As a part of the celebrations of 'Planning Week', a delightful question and answer session was organised. Mr. D'Mello, Chief Officer of Economic and Statistical Research Bureau answered many questions framed by the students and selected two best questions. The First best question award goes to Shri Dhananjay Shah (B.Com.Part-II) and Second to Shri Bharat Mehta (B.Com. Part-I). A fascinating lecture by Narottam Shah on "Priorities of Planning" was held. An essay competition was conducted. This was sponsored by Ministry of Broadcasting and Information.
