In all, over 150 volunteers were enrolled in the month of August, 1974. The activities for the year were formally inaugurated by Prof. N.F. Kaikobad of the Tata Institute of Social Sciences. When Prof. Pinge was also present, Dr. RAIRIKAR, the Principal of the college presided over the function. Though eight projects have been undertaken, the Children Aid Fund and WASEOH which is a National Survey of the Physically handicapped, were taken as the major activity. For House to House survey, our College was regarded as a Lead College and was chosen to supervise the activities of other six colleges.

Three Box collection drives - for the Children Aid Society - Vational Society for the Blind - and - for Cheshire Home - were conducted and over Rs. 3,000/- were collected for the purposes and donated.

The Youth Against Dirt and Disease Camp! was organised at Poman, an Adivasi village seven miles away from Bassein Road Station. 35 volunteers participated and dug a pit of 11' deep and 8' in diameter for the Gober Gas Plant and levelled a play-ground of the village school.

Slum Improvement Plans are being finalised under the expert assistance of Tata Institute of Social Sciences and in consultation with local people of Kasturbanagar. A survey of the area was undertaken and 'Healthy Baby Competition' and 'Clean' House Competitions were conducted. Lady volunteers are regularly visiting Orthopaedic Hospital for Reading to the Blind, organised at the Happy Home Blind School and Victoria Memorial Blind School.

The Blood Collection drives in collaboration of the Students' Council were organised twice in a year. In the first drive, 127 bottles of blood were collected for the Nair Hospital; while in a second drive organised for Morning Students, 100 bottles were collected for Sion Hospital.
