A brief project-wise report is given below :

SCHOOL PROJECT : The N.S.S. Unit of the college looks after the Adarsha Nagar Municipal Primary School. The volunteers collect the names and addresses of irregular students and contact the parents to persuade them to send their wards regularly.

READING FOR THE BLIND PROJECT : The volunteers go to two different schools for the Blind. Each volunteer on an average spends two hours a day to read for the blind.

SLUM IMPROVEMENT PROJECT : In Kasturba Nagar, a circulating library is run by the volunteers. They also help the students in solving their difficulties.

REMAND HOME PROJECT : The children in the remand home are entertained by our volunteers and conduct recreational activities.

FUNDS COLLECTION PROJECT : A Fund Collection drive was organised on 12th Sept. 1975 on Flag Day in aid of Blind. The total collection exceeded Rs. 2,800/-. Funds for Children's Aid Society were also collected from 1st October, 1975 to 6th October, 1975. For this purpose, 26 volunteers of the N.S.S. Unit were sent to the University N.S.S. Unit. In all 200 volunteers participated in the programme.

RURAL PROJECT : The village Gagode Budruk of Kolaba District the birth place of Acharya Vinobaji Bhave and a Gramdani village, is selected for Rural Project. From 1st of November, 1975, a special camp, under 'Youth Against Dirt and Disease' programme was organised, for 10 days, for 36 volunteers. They repaired the approach road to the village and levelled the School Play Ground. Prof. Kazi and Prof. Nareshkumar also participated in the camp, so also the two members of the administrative staff. In a Y.A.D.D. Camp arranged in Bombay, by the University Unit and the Tata Institute of Social Sciences at Worli Village, thirty one volunteers of our college and five volunteers of other N.S.S. Units participated. Prof. D.A. Pawar and Prof. A.N. Kutty, organised the camp. Our volunteers also visit Nair Hospital for writing the Blood Donation Cards. The college N.S.S. Unit also assists different Fun-Fair arranged by N.S.S. Units of other colleges to help the physically handicapped or the orphans. The N.S.S. Unit volunteers also participate in the Slum Improvement Project carried out by the N.S.S. Unit of the Sophia College.

FUN-FAIRS : The N.S.S. Volunteers organised a Fun-Fair at Mankhurd for the children of Bal-Kalyan Nagar along with four other colleges. In the fun fair held in the college in 16th and 17th of Jan. the N.S.S. Volunteers managed ten different stalls.

Our volunteers along with the volunteers of Sophia College organised the Athletic Meet of four Municipal Schools. In Blood Donation Drive N.S.S. Volunteers helped Nair Hospital Unit. 107 bottles of blood was collected from our college on 19th of Dec. 1975.

The College Stores started functioning from mid July 1975. Apart from the usual activities, it has ventured in the supply of essential commodities. SUMMING UP :

The academic year 1975-76 is fast fading away but the impressions of the year can not be erased easily. In the last four years, the growth of the college is enviably spectacular. It has worn a look of an old and established institution. What is being done in the initial years soon hardens into tradition. 1975-76 is a significant year multitudiously in terms of its achievements -- many things were consolidated. Lala Lajpat Rai Memorial Lectures have taken shape and will soon get adjusted in the time-table of the microscopic intellectuals of the city. For the first time this year, on behalf of the past students Association and 'tudents' Council, Founder's day, - the birth anniversary of Lala Lajpat Rai - was celebrated. When an eminent outsider - Dr. Miss. Usha Mehta was invited to talk on Lalaji's work and mission.

What is still more significant is, "outsiders" are inviting us on that day, probably because it is thought legitimately, that responsibility of carrying on Lalaji's work and mission lies heavily on the institution founded in the Centenary year to commemorate his memory. The head of the institution Dr. B.R. Raipurkar was called upon to speak on Lalaji as a Chief Guest in a public meeting organised by B.P.C.C. to celebrate the occasion.

In the extra-curricular activities, one can hardly find a parallel to ~~take~~ the so many achievements of the college in such a short span of time. For the last two years, we are fighting neck to neck with our competitors - all of them old and well established -- in the youth festival of the University and in the competitions held outside. In the Bombay University Youth Festival, though the luck has not favoured us to secure the first place, we are second - the "runners up" and none could dodge us from that position. So well acclaimed was our performance; that the conference of Lawyers wanted our dance to be staged for their guests, and the Priminister's Birth Celebration Committee requested the college, most graciously, to spare the item for the grand function. In the annual function of the Bombay University, the "dance" though a

second prize winner was selected in the handful items to be performed on the day. The press reported the performance with a photograph and the T.V. Unit telecast it for T.V. Viewers.

Even at the National Level, our prize spinner, "Lesson", and "Anuradha" bagged the first prizes in the All India Inter-Collegiate One Act Play competition - and though we are not as good on the play - ground as in the play-house, Rustom Havewala, our University and State Cycling Champion, has brought from Patiala for him and for the College National Championship.

On the academic side - Is it not gratifying and even surprising that despite quantitative growth of the college, there has been a significant qualitative improvement in results?

There is a marked qualitative improvement in the results from year to year. What is still more recording is the outstanding performance of our Scholar Shri Muncharjee Cama, who has secured for INAMURATA COLLEGE for the college "First Class" in Inter Commerce, Examination of the University of April 1975. When one recounts, that from 30 and odd Commerce College affiliated to Bombay University, from more than ten thousand students appeared for the examination, only eight students could get this distinction, one would be obliged to agree with our legitimate pride. This achievement, particularly has done lot of good to himself and to the college.

The Principal of the College was made an Executive Magistrate, and got elected to the highest authoritative body of the University, namely the Executive Council.

The College from Morning to evening is humming with activities. The D.S.M. & D.I.M., the Research Centre, the Staff Academy, the periodic C.A. Entrance Classes with a reputation of good results, and the proposed Inservice Course -- are all the necessary adjuncts which make an educational institution full-fledged.
