This year more than 500 students enrolled as N.S.S. Volunteers in July, 1976. The elections were held and Mr. Ravindra Waghmare was elected by majority as Secretary. Special diaries have been introduced from this year for recording the hours of work by the volunteers activities.

a) FUND COLLECTION:

450 students participated in the Children's Aid Society fund collection drive and secured almost second place for the highest collection.

Rs.400/- were collected for Teachers' Aid Fund on 6th Sept., 1976. 150 students collected fund for the Blind for which certificate of merit was awarded.

b) HOSPITAL PROJECT:

The N.S.S. Unit of the College remained attached to B.L.J. Nair Hospital, Orthopaedic Centre, Rehabilitation Centre, Sion Hospital and B.J. Home. The volunteers carried on duties like entertaining children, entering Blood Donation Cards attending to the patients and carrying on other kinds of work under the supervision of the Hospital authorities.

c) SLUM IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS:

More than 40 students carried on their work in Worli, Koliwada and Kasturba Nagar Slums through out the year. Kasturba Nagar slums committee in their annual report have recorded the work done by our Volunteers.

d) FUN FAIR PROJECT:

With the help of the North Bombay Jaycees a Fun Fair was organised for D.I.S.S. Institute for Children. The Volunteers also organised 2 additional Fun Fairs for Umar Khedi Remand Home and Mankhurd Remand Home.

Our students worked in the Happy Home for the Blind at Worli and the Victoria House for the Blind at Tardeo. Apart from the work assigned by the authorities, the Volunteers spent lot of their time for reading to the blind.

e) BLOOD DONATION PROJECT:

This year the College Unit organised Blood Donation Programme for the I.T.M.G. Hospital and Nair Hospital in the College and for the Indian Red Cross Society at Kalbadevi, Bombay. The Collection made this year has been record collection of 320 bottles and there is a possibility of the College Unit getting an award for the same.

f) EYE DONATION PROJECT:

About 30 volunteers attended a one day orientation course held at Sion Hospital under the auspices of the Eye Bank (J.J. Group of Hospitals). It is proposed to collect more than 100 consent forms from the people residing in the areas around the college.

Prof. Hemant Wagh attended the Orientation Course, organised by the Tata Institute of Social Sciences during the month of September, 1976.

g) RURAL CAMP:

A 10 days Rural Camp (from 27th Oct. to 5th Nov. 1976) was organised at Subhas Nagar, a village at Kelwa, Palghar Taluka.

The Volunteers dug a well, 13 feet in diameter and 7 feet in depth and also levelled the uneven roads to facilitate easier communications. A socio-economic survey was conducted by our volunteers, which brought a number of sad revelations to light. The unit also held regular meetings to discuss the problems of the Adivasis residing in the locality.

h) DAY CAMPS AT WORLI, KOLIWADA AND KASTURBA NAGAR:

The Social Service work was spread over 3 days (from 14th to 21st October, 1976). Socio-economic surveys of the localities were carried out and the importance of Family Planning impressed upon the residents. A campaign against dirt and disease was also undertaken. At Worli Koliwada 3 play grounds were cleaned and levelled and at Kasturba Nagar, the streets were cleaned. Health check-up programmes and a Healthy Baby competition were also organised. At both these places bread, ice-cream, vitamin pills etc. were distributed. Thanks are due to M/s. Kwality Ice.Cream Co., Glaxo, Park-Darps, Roche, Abbots etc. for their donations.

At Kasturba Nagar, a film SHAHEED was screened. Prizes, donated by our students Shri Piyush Mody and Shri Nimish Shah were distributed. Our grateful thanks to Shri G.B. Dube, President Nashabandi Mandal, who was our Chief Guest at Worli and to Shri Ramadas, Chief Guest at Kasturba Nagar.

Doctors, viz. Dr. S.G. Kamath M.D. and Dr. Mrs. J.A. Bilaney M.B.B.S. In addition it also gets the benefit of advise and guidance from eminent Physician Dr. S.P. Mehta. The Health Centre is open both in the Morning; and in the after noon for all the days of the week. Besides, the annual check up programme of the XIIth Std. students has nearly been completed. A special record card has been printed for the purpose and will be prescribed for the follow up.

Many students and the administrative staff take the benefit of the Health Centre. Arrangements have already been made for pathological tests. An.E.C.G. Machine has been generously donated by one of our trustees Shreeman S.S. Agarwal. The Centre also proposes to impart scientific sex education. So far 2 batches of girl students received education from Dr. Mrs. Bilaney, when the 15 girl students in a batch along with the professors had a long session of discussion. Prof. K. Gopkumar, Prof. Miss Daithankar and Prof. (Miss) Christie helped to organise the programme. Shri Joy looks after the day to day supply and purchases. However, the keen interest in the project is taken by the Principal himself and a full-fledged Health Centre no longer remains a dream to be realised.
