The academic activities of the year started in fullswing from the very beginning of the Ist term. The college
had on its roll a strength of 4485 students in various classes.
There were 71 faculty members. The college had nine divisions
of Std. XI with a strength of 777 students, and 9 divisions of
XIIth Standard with a total strength of 913 students in the
Junior college. The timings of the Junior College were from
1.00 p.m. to 5.30 p.m. At the Senior College level we had
F.Y.B.Com 9 divisions with 1072 students, S.Y.B.Com 6 divisions
with 602 students and B.Com Part II 7 divisions, with 3
divisions in the morning session having a strength of 489
students and 4 divisions in the day session with a strength of
545 students. The College is also authorised to enroll
students for M.Com and Ph.D.

Apart from these, the college had four semester course of Diplomas in Management Studies with a strength of 72 students.

The College has a number of associations and organisations through which the students give expression to their budding talents. The college has a very well equipped Library Catering to the needs of the students and the Members of the Staff. The Library has been made upto date with the assistance given by the U.G.C.

A notable feature of our college, of which we are really proud of is the well-equipped Health Centre which looks after the health of the students and the teachers. The Health Centre possessess and E.C.G. Machine, a Screening Machine, a Pathological Laboratory, and a Dental Unit.

The college has secured a prominent place in the Inter-Collegiate scene in Dramatics, 'Group Dance' in Elocution Competitions in Essay Competition and in Judo Competitions.

Even in a Social Service Activities we have proved that we are behind none, by helping all worthy causes by collecting funds such as Flood Relief Fund and organizing Blood Donation Drives.

The Staff and the Students brought honour for the College by virtue of their distinguished and outstanding performances in the curricular and extra curricular activities. Mention must be made of Shri Umesh Mallya, who brought credit to himself and to the college, by acheiving the rare distinction of securing a First Class for his B.Com Examination.

Several members of the staff have written books on their subjects which were well received and appreciated by the students and teachers of the University of Bombay.

Thus the curricular and extra curricular activities have secured a place of prominence for the college in the University of Bombay and has brought the honour of being one of the leading institutions in the academic world of the metropolis.
