The stores sold text books, note books varities of ball pens, inks pons, able tennis ball and a number of other articles. Our library and the Dook Bank were the largest customers.

#### THE COLLEGE LIBRARY:

The college has a well equipped library to cater to the needs of students and the members of the staff. The library works under the able supervision of Mrs. M.M. Shete who is assisted by Mrs. G. Srinivasan, Mr. A.S. Naik and :

Mr. S. Bhashyam, The library functions from 6.30 a.m. to 9.00 p.m. and also on sunday and many holidays. The advantages of the lending sections and the reference section of the college library have been fully utilised by the students and members of the staff. Every day on average of 150 - 200 books were issued out for reference, and every day on average of 150 books were issued out for home-reading.

The college has received a grant of Rs. 10,000 for the Library from the University of Bombay which was used for quipping the Library with recent books.

We are glad to note it here that our Library has now become a rich treasurer of knowledge from where our students and members of the staff draw information and inspiration.
