### LALA LAJPAT RAI COLLEGE LIBRARY

The College has a very well-equipped Library to cater the needs of the Students and the faculty members. The Library works under the able supervision of Mrs. M.M. Shete who was assisted by Mrs. G. Srinivasan, Mr. A.S. Naik, and Mr. S. Bashyam. By the close of this academic year Mrs. Srinivasan resigned from her post due to personal reasons. Library function from 6.30 a.m. to 9.00 p.m. and also on Sunday and many holidays. The advantages of Reading Reference Sections of the Library were fully utilised by the students and members of the staff.

Every day an average of 150-200 books were issued out for reference and 80-100 books were issued for home-reading. The present accommodation being inadequate to meet the demands of the students during examination, additional space is provided during the exam period.

The Library subscribes to 105 periodicals of which 35 are general and 70 are specialized. 16 more journals have been added this year.

The number of books added during 1979-80 is 1429. The strength of the Library on 31st March, 1980 is 13,512.

The College has received a grant of Rs. 20,000 for the Library from University of Bombay which was used to add recent books to the existing stock.

We are glad to note it that our Library has become rich treasure of knowledge from where our students and members of the staff draw information and inspiration.

#### THE ACTIVITIES OF THE MEMBERS OF THE STAFF

Mrs. Neeru Rastogi, our Economics faculty member working on problems and prospects of co-operative Sugar Factories in Uttar Pradesh', was awarded doctorate from Agra University. Prof. R.N. Joshi is also completing his doctorate with 'Job Satisfaction of workers in the light Chemical Industry' as his research subject.

Prof. B.R. Shah was elected Vice-President of the Institute of Internal Auditors, Dr. B.R. Rairikar and Prof. Hemant Wagh were elected to the Board of Extra Mural Studies by the University Senate.
