REPORT OF THE ACTIVITIES OF THE COLLEGE
FOR THE YEAR 1981-82.

INTRODUCTION :

The Academic year 1981-82 has been outstanding in the history of the College from the academic and extra-curricular point of view. We are looking back with pride to an year of tremendous ~~activiti~~ achievements in the academic field and satisfactory performance in the extra-curricular field.

On the extra-curricular field, the College has a number of organisation through which the students give expression to their budding talents. The different associations vive with each other to present better programmes to its members.

The College has a very well equipped Library catering to the needs of the students and members of the Staff. The Library has been made upto date with the assistance given by U.G.C. The Library has become a rich treasure of knowledge from where our students and members of the Staff draw information and inspiration.

A notable feature of our College, of which we are really proud of is the well-equipped Health Centre, which looks after the health of the students and members of the Staff.

The flag of the Lala Lajpatrai College has been kept flying this year also by our students in the inter-collegiate and national scene in Group Dances, Elouction Competition and other extra-curricular activities. Even in Social Service Activities our N.S.S. Unit has proved that we are in the forefront, by helping all worthy causes, by collecting Funds, organising camps and cultural activities and by organising Blood Donation Drives.

The academic activities of the College started in full swing from 20th June 1981. The College had on its rolls a total strength of 3576 students in various classes.

There were 70 faculty members. The College had 9 divisions of XI standard with a strength of 311 students and 9 divisions of XII standard with 313 students in the Junior College level. The Junior College timings were from 1.30 p.m. to ~~4.40~~ 5.50 p.m.

At the Senior College level we had 7 divisions of F.Y.B.Com. with a strength of 692 students and 6 divisions of S.Y.B.Com. with a strength of 482 students and 7 divisions of T.Y.B.Com. with a strength of 595 students. The College is also authorised to enroll students for M.Com. and Ph.D.

Apart from these classes, the college also had four semester course of Diploma in Management Studies with a strength of 162 students.

THE STRENGTH :

The Social Service activities of the year got inaugurated at the hands of Principal S.M. Parekh of the Bhavans College, Chowpathy on 4th August, 1931. In the formal function presided over by our Principal, Shri. S.M. Parekh.

formally inaugurated the activities by buying the first N.A.B. Coupons. That was the beginning of the manifold activities of this year.

Looking back to our performances, for the year, we would humbly claim that the year has been distinguished from the point of view of performances and ~~xxxxxx~~ achievements. Hence we present a brief account of our humble achievements for the year.

1. BLOOD DONATION DRIVES :

Our students and N.S.S. Volunteers have the noble tradition of responding in a big way to the blood Donation drives organised by the N.S.S. Unit. We have saved many a lives by donating blood. This year, we organised four blood Donation Drives.

This year we collected a record sum of nearly 10,000 Rupees for the different agencies recommended by the University. On December 17, 1981, our N.S.S. Volunteers assisted the Children orthopedic Hospital, Haji Ali, in organising a fun-fair in aid of the Orthopedically handicapped children. We put up two stalls and the proceeds were donated to the Hospital. Our Congratulations to Mr. Mohit Kapoor, Sanjay Gupta, Surendra Sodhani, Samir Shah, Naresh Parasram Puria, Manohar Upadhyia and Edwin D'Souza for suffessfully organising the Fun-Fair.

EXHIBITION ON THE PHYSICALLY HANDICAPPED :

One of the special features of this year's activities was the exhibition on the Physically handicapped, organised by our volunteer with the assistance of the Rehabilitation Centre

A mobile X'Ray unit was also utilised for T.B. and Cancer diagnosis. We could detect 20 suspected T.B. cases and the follow up action is being carried on.

We owe our sincere thanks to a number of Social service organisation, institutions and individuals for making this Medical camp a grand success. We are thankful to our Principal Dr. B.R. Rairikar for his guidance and help. We acknowledge that the Medical camp would have been impossible without the help and guidance of Dr. Naik and the other members of our Health Centre. We take this opportunity to express our thanks to the Shivaji Park Lions Club and

especially its President Sr. Gopal Hingo Rane, who extended financial help for the Medical Camp. We are highly grateful to Dr. Kammat, Dr. Ravishankar, Dr. Wagh, Dr. ~~Mar~~ Kulkarni, Dr. (Mrs.) Kulkarni and Dr. Bhanushali for their services.

The Medical Camp become a successful reality due to the pains taken by some of our N.S.S. Volunteers in the back stage. They sold the idea of our Medical Camp to the Pharmaceuticals/ companies in the city and obtained free medicines valued Rs. 12,000/-. We are highly indebted to the Pharmaceutical Companies in the City like Parke-Davis (India) Glaxo Laboratories (India), Warner Hindustan, German Remedies, May & Baker, Sarabhai Chemicals, Indoco, Zandhu Pharmaceutical S.G.
