REPORT OF THE ACTIVITIES OF THE COLLEGE

FOR THE YEAR 1983-84.

INTRODUCTION:

The academic year 1983-84 has been outstanding in the history of the College from the academic and extra-curricular point of view. We are looking back with pride to an year of tremendous achievements in the academic field and satisfactory performance in the extra-curricular field.

On the extra-curricular field, the college has a number of organisations through which the students give expression to their budding talents. The different associations vie with each other to present better programmes to its members.

The college has a very well equipped Library catering to the needs of the students and the members of the staff. The Library has been made upto date with the assistance given by the U.G.C. The Library has become a rich treasure of knowledge from where our students and members of the staff draw information and inspiration.

A notable feature of our college, of which we are really proud of is the well-equipped Health Centre, which looks after the health of the students and members of the staff.

The flag of Lala Lajpat Rai College has been kept flying this year also by our students in the inter Collegiate and national scene in Group Dance, Elocution Competition and other extra-curricular activities. Even in Social Service Activities, our N.S.S. unit has proved that we are in the fare front, by helping all worthy causes, by collecting Funds, organising camps and cultural activities and by organising Blood Donation Drives.

The academic activities of the college started in full swing from 20th June, 1983. The College had on its rolls a total strength of 3337 students in various classes.

There were 63 faculty members. The college had 9 divisions of XI standard with a strength of 890 students and 9 divisions of XII standard with 660 students in the Junior College level. The Junior College timings were from 1.00 p.m. to 5.20 p.m.

At the Senior College level we had 7 divisions of F.Y. B.Com. with a strength of 674 students and 6 divisions of S.Y. B.Com. with a strength of 656 students and 4 divisions of T.Y. B.Com. with a strength of 457 students. The College is also authorised to enroll students for M.Com. and Ph.D.

Apart from these classes, the college also had four Semester Course of Diploma in Management Studies with a strength of 136 students.

THE ACTIVITIES OF THE YEAR :

The N.S.S. Units of the College started their activities by organising a three day Orientation Programme to acquaint the volunteers with various N.S.S. Projects undertaken by the units. The main projects undertaken during the year were Blood Donation, Fund Collection, education, Project, Anti-T.B. Campaign, F.R.R.R. Camp, Hospital Project, etc. This year we took up new projects such as Immunisation, Anti-Leprosy Campaign and consumers guidance project.

1. BLOOD DONATION PROJECT :

As usual, this is one of the main projects taken up by the N.S.S. Unit. Our College is regularly contributing to Blood Banks of Nair Hospital for the past 10 years. This year too. We organised blood donation drive on 5th September, 1983 and 6th January, 1984. This year a total of 150 bottles of blood was donated. The Inter Division Blood Donation Trophy of the College was bagged by T.Y. B.Com. 'A' Division for donating the maximum quantity of Blood.

2. FUND COLLECTION PROJECTS :

and Red Cross Rs. 295/-

This year we also have collected funds for Saurashtra and Konkan Flood affected people. About 35 volunteers participated in and the collection was Rs. 5,487/-

3. EDUCATION PROJECT :

'Each are teach one' is one of the major Education Project taken up by nearly 25 volunteers who taught illiterate persons in their neighbourhood.

4. ANTI T.B. CAMPAIGN PROJECT :

This project involves identification of T.B. Patients and reporting such cases to the corporation clinics. Nearly 40 N.S.S. Volunteers took 40 the project and identified about 175 T.B. patients in the Prabhadevi area of the city.

5. Y.F.R.R. CAMP :

It is the youth for Rural Reconstitution project known popularly as Rural Camp. This year the camp was organised at Jambhivali Adivasi Village near Karjat for 10 days. The work undertaken by our Volunteers was salvation of the foot over bridge connecting the village with 5 tribal hamlets. The unique event during the camp was medical check-up of about 1000 persons from the area and donation of medicines work Rs. 15,000/-.

We record our thanks to our doctors and College Health Centre for extending their guidance and participation in the Medical Camp.

6. Hospital Project :

This year our volunteers associated with Nair, St. George and Childrens Orthopaedic Hospitals. The Volunteers worked in the hospitals, associating patients and organised games and entertainment programmes for the handicapped.

7. IMMUNIZATION AND ANTI-LEPROSY PROJECT :

Our N.S.S. Unit was one of the active participants in these projects organised by the Health Department of the State Government. About 30 volunteers in rotation participated in these projects at Kandivali and Dharavi Slum areas in Bombay.

8. CONSUMERS GUIDANCE PROJECT :

This project was jointly organised by our N.S.S. Unit and the Consumer Guidance Society of India. The project was organised in the month of January 1984 for 15 days. The project composed of three main activities.

- i. Orientation Course for the volunteers to enlighten them about consumers right.
- ii. Socio-economic survey for evaluation of consumer status.
