REPORT OF THE ACTIVITIES OF THE COLLEGE
FOR THE YEAR 1984-85.

INTRODUCTION :

The academic year 1984-85 has been a very distinguished year in the history of the college from the academic and Extra Curricular point of view. We had outstanding activities in the academic field and splendid performance in the Extra-curricular fields.

The college has become a Centre for high academic discussions, thanks to the number of Seminars we organised through out the year. The Seminars were organised by the College in collaboration with the Department of Commerce of the University of Bombay. The first Seminar organised in the month of January 1985, was on Seventh Five Year Plan. The contributors were men of eminence in Economics like Dr. Lakdawala, Dr. Bhramananda, etc. The Second and Third Seminars were conducted on 30th and 31st March 1985, on "Dynamics of Poverty" and "Income Distribution - Trends in India" respectively. The financial aid for the Seminar was provided by I.C.S.S.R. The College has become a centre of high academic pursuit under the guidance of our Principal Dr. B.R. Rairikar. This year two students, Shri. Guruprasad Murthi and Shri. R. Gopal were awarded the degree of Ph.D. by the University of Bombay. Both of them worked under the guidance of Principal Dr. B.R. Rairikar. Another forum of intellectual discussion was the Lala Lajpatrai Memorial lecture organised every year to commemorate the memory of Lala Lajpatrai. This year the lecture was delivered by Dr. S.A. Dave, Executive Director of I.D.B.I. on "Political Economy, Irrelevant Economics and Economic Growth". Dr. Sandesara of the Economics Dept. of University of Bombay presided over the function. Another heartening events is the nomination of the Principal as R.B.'s. nominee on the Board of Directors of a Scheduled Bank.

The college has very well equipped Library, made upto date by the constant guidance given by our Principal and the assistance given by the U.G.C. to cater to the needs of the students and the members of the Staff. The Library has become a rich treasure of knowledge from where our students and members of the staff draw information and inspiration.

In the extra-curricular field also we had a number of splendid achievements and proud performances, this year also. The flag of Lala Lajpatrai College has been kept flying high this year also by our students in the national and the inter-collegiate scene. Even in Social Service activities, our N.S.S. Unit has proved that we are in the forefront by helping all worthy causes by collecting funds, organising camps and cultural activities and by organising Blood Donation Drives.

The academic activities of the college started in full swing from 20th June, 1984. The college had on its roll a total strength of 3560 students in various classes.

The College had 9 divisions of XI standard with a strength of 398 students and 8 divisions of XII standard with 692 students in the Junior College level. The Junior College timings were from 1.00 p.m. to 5.20 p.m.

At the Senior College level we had 7 divisions of F.Y.B.Com. with a strength of 749 students and 6 divisions of S.Y.B.Com. with a strength of 595 students and 5 divisions of T.Y.B.Com. with a strength of 572 students. The College is also authorised to enroll students for M.Com. and Ph.D.

Apart from these classes, the college also had four Semester Course of Diploma in Management studies with a strength of 54 students.

THE ACTIVITIES OF THE YEAR :

The year 1985, being the Youth Year, we participated in maximum of Youth activities and came out with flying colours. We have added to our crown two "YOUTH FESTIVAL TROPHIES" (TRIOS AND JALLOSH) and the Runners up Trophy of Manali.- All India Winter Carnival. In Trios Youth Festival, our dramas in three languages (Gujarati, Marathi and Hindi) came first. Miss Channa Ruparel bagged six top awards for her individual performances followed by Asha Shelar, Nilesh Brahmopal, Joaquim Baretto, Ajaway Sawant and Saroj Sawani. Our dance "Surya Pooja" is a three time winner. It was adjudged as best at Manali and Trios while in North Bombay Jaycess it stood second. For the first time we participated in English and Konkani Drama competition at Bombay University Youth Festival and both plays were Winners of the festival.

The following is the list of prizes we bagged in the various competitions during the year 1984-85.

At Trios Youth Festival our Group Dance "Surya Pooja" bagged the First Prize. Our Dramatics Society brought many honours to the College this year also. Marathi plays bagged the First Prizes. Our Hindi Play bagged the Second Prize. No Final Prize was awarded in the competition.

Our students won the Best Actor Prize in Gujarati Competition and the best Actress Prize in Gujarati, Hindi and Marathi Competitions and also the Second Best Actress Prize in Marathi competition.

In solo dance competition Miss. Mona Malhotra bagged the Third Prize. In Instrumental Music Jay "ANTANI" got the Fourth Prize.

In the Library even to Subir Kaunds reached the Semi-finals in what's a good word? In Debate our team comprising

of Mr. Anand Patwardhan stood third. In Elocution Miss. Kashmira Vaghaiwala got a participation prize.

Our Literary Team participated in a number of literary events in the Bombay University Youth Festival.
